Dear Parents:

Thank you for taking the first steps toward admission to Seacoast Christian School. We encourage you in prayerful consideration of the Lord's will for your child's education. We wish to help you along every step of the way. Please review the items below, and don't hesitate to get in touch with us by phone, e-mail, or in person if we may be of assistance.

Completing the Application Process:

Enclosed you will find the necessary application forms and information sheets. *Homeschool families should submit student portfolio in place of the School Records Release Form.*

For Grades 1-6:

- School Records Release Form (this goes to your school's main office after you complete it)
- Teacher Recommendation Form (a current teacher should complete and mail this to the school)

For Grades 7-12:

- Both of the above items
- Student Questionnaire (to be completed by your child)
- Statement of Accountability
- Personal Spiritual Reference (from your child's pastor or youth pastor)

After reviewing your child's complete application, the school may test your child for academic readiness. This is typically done in grades K-8.

Parents of children applying for kindergarten and first grade should look over the enclosed sheet for additional information regarding testing. There is some basic knowledge that children should already have obtained, and some basic skills that they should be able to handle in order to make a smooth transition into school. These are general guidelines, not absolutes.

Please let us know of any concern with your child's readiness for school.



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Tuition Payment Options:

Please see the attached sheet with the current tuition. As a Christian school with the obligation to be “wise stewards” of the funds that have been granted to us (Luke 16), we are constantly looking for ways to hold expenses down and direct our resources toward our primary goal of Christian Educations.

One way that we can reduce labor and cost is through the use of automatic bank withdrawals. Many Christian schools throughout the US already use automatic withdrawals as the preferred method for tuition payments because that process reduces costs and makes it easier for families to pay tuition.

To handle the mechanics of the automatic withdrawal plan, we continue to contract with FACTS Management Company. Because they have extensive experience in the independent school field and a proven reputation for excellent customer service, **FACTS** is the clear choice to serve our school community. Virtually all of our SCS families have already used **FACTS** for automatic withdrawal tuition payment. Exceptions are granted only under extenuating circumstances.

For the upcoming school year, the options to pay tuition are as follows:

- 1.) Full payment of the entire year's tuition by the end of August, directly to the school, with a 4% tuition discount.*
- 2.) 10, 11 or 12 monthly automatic payments through FACTS, completed by June 2023.*

New families can sign-up through the FACTS website. Tuition payments normally begin in August, on either the 5th or 20th, but payments can be started in July, and can be spread over eleven or twelve months.

Website process - Log onto <https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/4FVG9> and follow the directions. SCS will pay the **FACTS** Enrollment Fee.

Tuition Assistance Program:

Seacoast Christian School considers any request for tuition grants for any families that apply online through the FACTS Grant and Aid Assessment website. The application fee is \$30. **FACTS** evaluates applications in a fair, independent review and allows us to offer assistance to families in financial need.

Student Spiritual Accountability:

Please keep in mind that we are a Christian school operating from a Christian world-life view and philosophy of education. Any student who does not demonstrate interest in spiritual matters and a willingness to conform to Biblical standards of behavior will probably find it difficult to adjust to the school and benefit from the many aspects of a Christian education.

Financial Policies:

- ◆ **Registration:** A non-refundable registration fee is required to enroll a new student for the fall.
- ◆ **Tuition payment plans:** Tuition installment plans (10-month, 11-month or 12-month) are offered online through FACTS Management Company. Parents who withdraw their student from school during the year are responsible for tuition through the month of withdrawal.
- ◆ **Returned checks:** A return check fee of \$20.00 will be assessed on returned checks.
- ◆ **Full-payment discount:** A 4% discount can be taken if the yearly tuition is paid in full by the end of August.

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Tuition Assistance 2022-2023

We understand that tuition can be a burden on a family's finances. At Seacoast Christian School we want to help in any way we can to make sure your child(ren) can attend here.

Here are the steps for applying for tuition assistance:

- We use a third-party company, FACTS, to process all financial aid applications. They require a \$30 fee to apply.
- Please apply as soon as possible. Applications can be submitted in February, and we ask that all applications be completed by April 30. For families receiving this packet after April 30, please apply ASAP
- Apply at <https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/4FVG9>
- Once the application has been completed and all required documents submitted, Jenny Cardinal (School Treasurer) will contact you to set up a phone call to clarify information and ask some additional questions.
- The Tuition Assistance Committee will respond to you within two weeks.
- You may simply accept any assistance offered, or you can ask for further review.
- Once you are ready to enroll, Carol Corbett (Bookkeeper) will contact you regarding your payment plan.

PLEASE NOTE: NH residents applying for tuition assistance will be required to apply for the NH Education Freedom Account before being considered for tuition assistance from SCS. The website is <https://nh.scholarshipfund.org/apply/nh-education-freedom-accounts/>

Tuition Assistance is supported by limited funds, and we are budgeting fewer dollars next year than we did this year. We thank each parent who submitted their FACTS application promptly last year, and we encourage you to do the same this year. We trust the LORD to provide in all things. 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Statement of Faith

The doctrinal basis of SCS shall be the Word of God. It will structure itself on the teachings of the Holy Bible and not on the doctrines of any particular denomination. Each member of the Board of Directors of SCS (hereafter referred to as the Board) and each member of the staff of SCS must have accepted Jesus Christ as personal Savior, and shall agree in writing with the following statement of Faith. We believe the following statements are essential doctrines of the faith "once delivered unto the saints" for which we must earnestly contend as sound doctrine (Jude 3).

- 1.) We believe in the verbal, plenary, infallible inspiration of both Old and New Testaments in their original texts as the final authority for the church in matters of faith and conduct. (2 Tim. 3:16, 17; 2 Pet. 1:21)
- 2.) We believe that there is one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, who created all things and is infinitely perfect in all His attributes. (Gen. 1:1; Mat. 28:19)
- 3.) We believe in the full deity and full humanity of our Lord Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, His sinless life, His vicarious and atoning death, His bodily resurrection, His ascension to Heaven, His present mediatorial work, and His future personal coming again. (John 1:1; Phil. 2:5-11; 1 Pet. 2:22; 1 Cor. 15:3,4; Heb. 4:14-16; John 14:3; Acts 1:11)
- 4.) We believe in the deity and personality of the Holy Spirit and in His regenerating, sanctifying, empowering, and comforting work in all believers. (Acts 5:3,4; John 3:5-8; John 16:7-14)
- 5.) We believe that God created the heavens and the earth, light and darkness, the sky and waters, the sea and land, vegetation according to its various kinds, the day and night, the fish of the sea and the birds of the air, the creatures of the earth according to their kinds. (Gen. 1:1-25)
- 6.) We believe in the divine creation of man in the image of God, and that man fell into sin in Adam, is now a sinner by nature and by choice, and is thereby under the just condemnation of God. (Gen. 1:26,27; 2:7; Rom. 5:12-21; John 3:18,36)
- 7.) We believe that man is saved by grace through faith being redeemed by the blood of Christ and justified by faith in Christ apart from any human merit. (Eph. 2:8,9; Rom. 3:24-26; 1 Tim. 3:5,6)
- 8.) We believe that the church is the universal company of the redeemed, the body of Christ, of which Christ is the Head. (Eph. 1:22,23; 2:19-22)
- 9.) We believe that every true believer has eternal security in Christ being kept by the power of God. (1 Pet. 1:1-3; John 10:27,28; John 5:24; John 6:39-40; Jude 24)
- 10.) We believe in the bodily resurrection of all mankind: the saved into the everlasting blessedness of their glorified state in Heaven, and the unsaved into the eternal punishment of hell separated from the presence of God. (1 Thess. 4:16-17; 1 Cor. 15:51-55; 2 Thess. 1:8,9; Rev. 20:11-21:5)
- 11.) We believe that marriage has been instituted by God. It is defined as the exclusive covenantal union of one man and one woman in which such union is a lifetime commitment. A civil government's sanction of a union will be recognized as a legitimate marriage by the school only to the extent that it is consistent with the definition of "marriage" found in these Articles. Gen. 2:24; Mt. 19:4-6; Eph. 5:33; Heb. 13:4
- 12.) We believe that legitimate sexual relations are exercised solely within marriage. Hence, sexual activities outside of marriage including but not limited to, adultery, premarital sex, homosexuality, and pedophilia are inconsistent with the teachings of the Bible. Further, lascivious conduct, transgender behavior, and the creation and/or distribution and/or viewing of pornography, are incompatible with the biblical witness. 1 Thess. 4:3-8; Ex. 20:14; 1 Cor. 6:18; Eph. 5:3; 1 Cor. 6:9; Rom. 1:24-27; Heb. 13:4



Seacoast Christian School Dress Code 2022-2023

Honoring God: Neat, Clean, and Modest

The clothing style worn during the school day at Seacoast Christian School should honor God and follow Biblical principles of “neat, clean, and modest” without worldly influences.

As Christians, we sometimes have different traditions of how we dress outside of school. Romans 14 teaches plainly that we are to honor each other for things we do “as unto the Lord” even when we differ in how we do this. This is a simple and clear teaching about responding to our differences, whenever our intentions are to truly honor God.

We offer this **guide** to bring a spirit of unity and simplicity.

Every Christian adult in the school carries a responsibility to set a godly example in our dress, and to discretely discuss any dress concerns with students. We ask parents to support us in our efforts, as we are in the world, but as Christians we are not of the world (John 17).

As the waves of the world continue to roar, with winds sometimes blowing in every direction, please help us to keep Seacoast a God-honoring “safe harbor” for all our students and families.

Dress Down Days

We encourage the participation in dress down days. Because we are still in school:

- Modesty is expected.
- T-shirts that are authentic SCS t-shirts or have a Christian logo on them may be worn.
- No shirts with cut off sleeves may be worn.
- Hats should be removed before entering the building, as a sign of respect

Hair Requirements

No unnatural hair colors or styles are allowed.

Boys’ hair length should be neat and off the collar.

Boys’ facial hair must be neat and trimmed.

Elementary Cold/Winter Weather

During winter and on cold days (near or below freezing) in other seasons, all students must have for outside recess:

- a winter jacket
- snow pants
- mittens or gloves
- a hat
- boots for outside recess.

Indoor shoes may be brought for classroom use.

Elementary Student Footwear: For safety, no open-back sandals or flip-flops.

If such characteristics are observed sometime after a student is enrolled, we reserve the right to see that the student is withdrawn.

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STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

This statement should be read carefully and signed by both parents before applications can be processed.

A. In applying for admission to Seacoast Christian School, I understand that the administration, faculty, and staff will purpose to:

1. encourage my child to come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ;
2. train each saved child to glorify God in word and deed;
3. and instruct each child in matters of religion according to the school's doctrinal position.

I understand that certain theological matters discussed in class may differ from the views held by non-Protestant religions.

B. In understanding the distinctiveness of Christian education I will cooperate with the school's effort to:

1. train my child spiritually, mentally, morally, socially, and physically;
2. maintain a dress code consistent with Biblical standards;
3. enforce all rules and regulations established by the school.

C. I understand that the classroom teacher needs to maintain order for effective learning to take place. I also understand that deliberate acts of misbehavior or persistent disobedience must be dealt with. I will accept responsibility to handle the discipline of my child when notified by the school that such discipline is necessary.

D. In order to establish and maintain a wholesome and positive spiritual atmosphere, I understand that the administration reserves the right to dismiss any student at any time during the school year who demonstrates that he does not respect the spiritual standards or rules of the school. Acts of stealing or cheating; possession or use of cigarettes, illegal drugs, or alcohol; and instances of sexual immorality at or away from school will be grounds for immediate dismissal.

E. I understand that students are accepted each year on a six week probational period for evaluation in academic achievement, spiritual responsiveness, and right conduct.

F. If difficulties or differences arise, I will seek resolution in a Christian manner by first discussing the matter privately with the party involved.

G. If my child is responsible for willful destruction or defacing of school property or rented facilities, or if such damage occurs through irresponsible behavior, I accept responsibility to make restitution.

H. I give permission for my child to participate in school activities including physical education, recess activities, and class excursions, and I absolve the school from liability to me or my child for any injury that may be sustained at school during school activities.

I. I understand the importance of consistent attendance and will try to avoid unnecessary absences and tardiness. I will also notify the school by 9:00 A.M. if my child is absent in order to ensure the safety of all students.

J. I agree to supply the school with a copy of my child's most recent report card, a copy of his/her birth certificate, and a copy of his/her immunization records.

K. In signing this statement I understand that I am responsible to honor the financial policies of the school explained on the information sheet for the academic year in which my child attends. I understand that if I fail to keep up with my tuition payments my child may have to withdraw from the school. I also understand that it is the policy of the school to withhold academic records and transcripts of students transferring or graduating until all outstanding bills are paid in full.

I have read the school's doctrinal Statement of Faith, I understand my financial commitments, and I agree to honor this Statement of Cooperation.
